**“Say No to Drugs, Yes to Life”**

Under the vision of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and the guidance of Hon'ble Union Home Minister Shri Amit Shah and Hon'ble Lt. Governor Shri V.K. Saxena, Delhi Police, led by Commissioner Shri Sanjay Arora, is fully committed to 'Nasha Mukh Bharat Abhiyan' through a 'Zero Tolerance Policy' against drug abuse.

Driven by a multi-agency strategy, the focus is on curbing supply, reducing demand, and protecting vulnerable groups, especially youth—through enforcement, awareness, and rehabilitation for a balanced response.

In 2024, 1,789 NDPS cases were registered and 2,290 traffickers arrested — a significant rise over previous years. This year, up to 15th June, 1,127 cases and 1,439 arrests have already been made. Daily seizures and arrests in drug cases continue across Delhi.

Under PITNDPS Act, properties of drug traffickers are being seized to cripple their finances. So far, 28 preventive detentions have been issued, and ₹7.76 crore worth of assets have been seized. Properties worth ₹19.03 crore are under final attachment.

Public awareness drives are being conducted in coordination with various Departments of Govt. of Delhi. Citizens are encouraged to report drug crimes via the MANAS Portal ([1933/ncbmanas.gov.in](http://1933/ncbmanas.gov.in)) or call helpline 14446 for support, information, and rehabilitation.

Drugs ruin lives. Together, we can build a safer, healthier, drug-free Delhi.

## DELHI POLICE : COMMITTED TO DRUG FREE DELHI



Drug abuse and trafficking pose a serious threat to public health, safety, and social stability. In Delhi, the rising involvement of youth and vulnerable communities in the drug trade — both as consumers and carriers — has made the menace even more alarming. Narcotics not only destroy lives but also fuel crime, violence, and organized networks.

To tackle this growing threat, Delhi Police has adopted a 'Zero-Tolerance Approach'. Regular operations are being conducted across the City, leading to daily arrests of peddlers and smugglers, major narcotics seizures, and the confiscation of illegally acquired properties. Preventive detention under the PITNDPS Act is also being invoked to break the backbone of trafficking networks.

Backed by a comprehensive, multi-agency strategy, the focus is on supply disruption, demand reduction, and harm mitigation — with special attention to safeguarding youth and at-risk population. Enforcement efforts are complemented and supplemented by awareness drives and rehabilitation support, creating a balanced response to the crisis.

The consistent rise in NDPS cases and arrests over the years reflects Delhi Police's unwavering commitment for eliminating the drug menace and ensuring a safer, healthier society.

# CRUSHING THE DRUGS. BRIGHTENING THE FUTURE

## DRUG DESTRUCTION :



Aligned with the Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor's vision of a "Drug-Free Delhi by 2027," Delhi Police regularly conducts Mega Drug Destruction Events, reaffirming its commitment to eradicating drug abuse and ensuring a safer capital.

In compliance with Hon'ble Supreme Court directives and under the 'Nasha Mukh Bharat Abhiyan,' dedicated committees have been formed to dispose off seized drugs at regular intervals. Over the past two years, large quantities of illegal narcotics have been destroyed.



## DRUG DESTRUCTION IN 2025 :

Recently, sixth round of Drug Destruction programme was held on 3rd April, 2025 by Delhi Police, in which 1,643.074 kilograms drugs (cases of year 2004-2024) of Districts/Crime Branch/Special Cell, with an estimated international market value of ₹ 2,622 crore was destroyed.

Earlier, as part of the nationwide Drug Disposal Fortnight (January 11 to January 25, 2025), Delhi Police organized a Mega Drug Destruction Event on 24th January 2025, during which 1,575 kilograms of Ganja, worth approximately ₹ 15.75 crores, was destroyed.



# FINANCIAL INVESTIGATION

## FREEZE THE CASH, CUT THE CHAIN, END THE TRADE

- ◆ As part of financial investigations, Delhi Police is actively identifying, seizing, and freezing assets of drug traffickers, striking at the very foundation of their illegal trade.
- ◆ Properties worth Rs. 7.76 Crore of 46 drug traffickers seized.
- ◆ Assets worth Rs. 19.03 Cr of 24 others, at final stage.
- ◆ Properties of 30 other Narco criminals are being identified for strict legal action.

# OPERATION KAVACH

**WAR ON DRUGS : Dealers & Traffickers Apprehended,  
Networks Dismantled.**

- To combat the drug menace comprehensively, the Crime Branch and District Police launched a joint operation—Operation KAVACH—across Delhi in May 2023. The mission focused on identifying and apprehending individuals involved in narcotics trafficking and distribution. The strategy targeted both street-level peddlers and high-level traffickers, adopting a top-down and bottom-up approach for maximum impact.
- The remarkable success of Operation KAVACH 1.0 paved way for follow up action under KAVACH 2.0 to KAVACH 8.0 in order, with the latest Operation KAVACH 8.0 being held on 18-19 June, 2025.

## Operation Kavach 8.0 → 18 - 19 June '25 :



- In a major crackdown endeavour KAVACH 8.0 witnessed simultaneous operations conducted across 15 districts of Delhi by all District/ Units including Crime Branch & Special Cell.
- **139 Narco offenders were arrested in 133 NDPS cases.**
- Drugs recovered include 90.3 grams Heroin; 25.9 Kg of Ganja; 3.32 grams of Cocaine; 4.63 gram MDMA; 20.08 grams Amphetamine & 12 Buprenorphine Tablets.
- **217 Delhi Excise Act Cases : 224 arrests, seizure of 125 Beer bottles, 158 Beer Cans, 47476 Quarters of illicit liquor.**
- **29 Arms Act Cases : 30 arrests, recovery of 06 Semi Automatic pistols, 02 Country Made Pistols, 07 live cartridges, 03 Magazines & 23 Knives.**
- **28 Gambling Act Cases : 55 persons arrested. Rs. 25,592 cash recovered.**
- **01 Arrested under COTPA Act. 469 E- Cigarettes & 1,71,200 prohibited foreign Cigarettes recovered.**
- **5,682 individuals were taken into preventive custody,.**
- **66 DP Act Cases : 494 Vehicles seized.**
- **Two Proclaimed Offenders & One Auto Lifter Arrested.**

# OPERATION KAVACH DEPLOYMENT: A RETROSPECTIVE

## Operation Kavach 1.0 → 12 May '23:



- A mammoth 80 teams comprising of over 1000 Delhi Police personnel drawn from ANTF, the Crime Branch & District Police launched a hugely successful Operation KAVACH crushing the nexus of drug mafia on the night of 12<sup>th</sup> May '23.
- More than 100 locations across Delhi raided.
- 43 arrests made.
- Recoveries included 957.5 gm Heroin, 57.884 gm Ganja and 782 ltr illicit liquor.

## Operation Kavach 2.0 → 19 - 20 June '23:

- 128 chosen places were raided by a joint operation by ANTF, Crime Branch, Special Cell and District Police.
- 64 Narco Offenders were arrested. 62 FIRs filed.
- Recoveries included 30 kg Ganja; 345 gms Heroin; and 140 gms of Amphetamine,
- Survey and studies by ANTF revealed 64 drug hotspots. It also revealed that Cannabis and Heroin are the two most popular narcotic substances, peddled in Delhi.



## Operation Kavach 3.0 → July- August '23:



- Kavach 3.0 was a month long operation focusing on 25 active drug peddlers.
- 25 Police teams from ANTF & Crime Branch carried out this operation
- 39 Drug Offenders were arrested. Recovery included 2.939 kg Heroin; 315.7 kg Ganja; 1.589 kg Charas; 983.5 gm Cannabis oil; 120 Ecstasy tablets; 1.217 kg Opium; 238.17 kg Bhuki; 203.701 gms Crystal & 107 gms organic Ganja

# OPERATION KAVACH DEPLOYMENT: A RETROSPECTIVE

## Operation Kavach 4.0 → 28 Nov.' 23



- Targeted the violators of COTPA Act and led a crackdown on Tobacco/ Pan Shops in the 100 meters vicinity of educational institutions
- Launched on the basis of information provided by Department of Education
- 70 challans were issued and Rs 14,000/- fine was collected from shops selling tobacco products, within 100 meter vicinity of schools/ colleges.

## Operation Kavach 5.0 → 31 Aug - 1 Sept. '24:

- 325 locations were raided in 15 districts of Delhi.
- 74 Narco Offenders were arrested in 66 NDPS cases.
- Recoveries included 108.93 gms of Heroin; 66.28 Kg of Ganja; 1100 gms of Charas; 16 gms MDMA.
- 54 violators of Delhi Excise Act were also arrested. Recoveries from them included 78 bottles of liquor, 24 bottles of Beer; 5089 Quarters of illicit liquor; 1 Scooty used for bootlegging.



## Operation Kavach 6.0 → 12-13 Nov. '24:



- 907 locations were raided in a coordinated operation by 150 Police teams drawn from Districts, Crime Branch and Special Cell.
- 145 arrests were made in 143 NDPS cases with seizure of 870.1 gm Heroin; 244.8 kg Ganja; 16.1 gm cocaine; 434 gm MDMA, Rs. 34,420/- cash;
- 207 arrests were made in 208 Excise Act cases with seizure of large amounts of illicit liquor.
- 14 offenders arrested in Arms Act cases.

# OPERATION KAVACH DEPLOYMENT: A RETROSPECTIVE

## Operation Kavach 7.0 → 12 & 13 February '25



→ In a mega crackdown endeavour KAVACH 7.0 witnessed 200 Delhi Police teams from all districts including the Crime Branch and the Special Cell conducting a coordinated raid spread over 24 hours (12- 13 February '25) across 784 locations in Delhi.

→ The hugely successful Operation led to : 92 arrests in 89 NDPS cases and the seizure of : 811.05 gm Heroin; 43.143 kg ganja; 119 gm cocaine; 2,07,600 Alprazolam tablets

→ 157 Excise Act Cases : 161 arrests, seizure of 37 cans/bottles of Beer, 33,098 Quarters & 05 Vehicles.

→ 27 Arms Act Cases : 29 arrests, recovery of 06 Country made pistols, 01 revolver, 11 live cartridges, 01 pistol, Rs 24,000 cash, 18 knives, 02 stolen motorcycles & 02 stolen rickshaws.

→ A total of 1407 violators were prosecuted under COPTA Act.

→ 6,301 individuals were taken into preventive custody, demonstrating a zero-tolerance policy against crimes.


Stupendous Response to online painting competition organised by ANTF, Delhi Police

School heads, teachers, parents, and DOE counselors actively contributed, with counselors offering guidance on early signs, support, and referrals.

The ANTF Mobile Van showcased educational videos and student artworks on drug prevention, further amplifying the message. With the dedicated support of CICs, nodal officers, and counselors, the campaign was successfully and enthusiastically conducted across the city.

Addiction is a major public health issue in India, affecting people across all demographics. Delhi-NCR ranks among the top regions for substance use disorders, with rates of alcohol, cannabis, and opioid use exceeding national averages. Nearly 90% of street children in the region are affected. Delhi's strategic location also makes it a hotspot for drug trafficking.

To address this, a multi-pronged strategy is essential—supply reduction (by Delhi Police, NCB), demand reduction (via healthcare treatment), and harm reduction (through NGO efforts). The "Nasha Mukta Bharat Abhiyan" launched in 2020 and the Hon'ble LG's call for a "Drug-Free Delhi by 2027" underline the urgency.

Schools, colleges, and civil society must join hands with the government to expand awareness, prevention, and evidence-based treatment. Investing in addiction recovery is investing in our nation's future. Together, we can build a healthier, drug-free Delhi.
